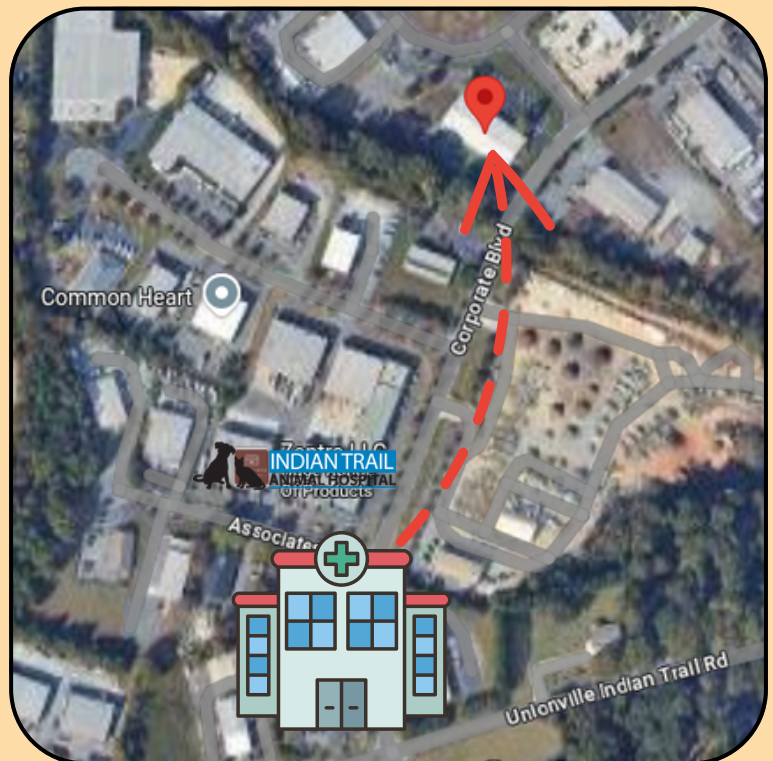
Construction Update!

CASE STUDY: HIND LIMB LAMENESS

Cranial cruciate ligament ruptures is among the most common causes of hindlimb lameness in dogs. Signs at home may include a sudden or gradual onset of limping on non-weight bearing on a back leg. The cranial cruciate ligament (called the ACL in humans) stabilizes the knee and prevents sliding and rotating of the knee while walking. Causes of ligament rupture include gradual degeneration over time, skeletal conformation, trauma, and obesity. A physical examination and X-rays are used to diagnose CCL rupture. Treatment includes surgery to stabilize the knee, medical management and rehabilitation, or often a combination of both to help your pet have the best chance to return to normal activity level!
