# Tales from the Trail

*Summer is almost here and many pets will be traveling with their families. Here are some tips for keeping them safe while you travel:*

**Restraint is key!**

Use a crate, carrier, or pet harness secured with a seatbelt to prevent pets from being thrown around in an accident or becoming a distraction to the driver.

**NEVER** leave a pet unattended in a parked car, especially in hot or cold weather. Leaving the windows open is not enough!

**Backseat is Best**

Keep pets in the backseat away from airbags, which can be dangerous!

Don't allow pets to put their heads out the window, as they can be hit by debris or get injured.

**If your pet experiences anxiety during car rides, our veterinarians may be able to prescribe a medication to help!**

**Practice rides!**

Gradually acclimate your pet to car rides with short, enjoyable trips.

**Hydrate!**

Stop for breaks every few hours to let your pet relieve themselves and drink water.

Be sure that your pet has identifying information on their collar including your contact information and consider a microchip for an additional safety net.
